1. Do you have experience as an elected official and if so, what was your position, and how would you describe your voting record?

Not yet elected to public office. I was nominated to represent the Republican Party in the 1988 election to become a member of Congress in California's 13th Congressional District (San Jose - Silicon Valley). I have also been involved in several clubs and political organizations such as Toastmasters, the Panhandle Pachyderm Club, the Reagan Republicans, the Kootenai County Republican Central Committee (KCRCC) as both a precinct committeeman (PC) and parliamentarian. I am a lifelong conservative.

2. Please tell us about your activity as a Republican. Have you previously voted for candidates of other parties? If yes, explain.

Yes. I voted for Jimmy Carter in 1976 because I believed that he would either do a lot of good, or a lot of bad. I was right. To me at the time, Gerald Ford represented the status quo and at 20 years of age I believed we needed change. Ronald Reagan almost beat Ford for the nomination in 1976 and went on to beat Carter in a landslide in 1980. I voted for Reagan in both cases.

3. What is the purpose of government?

To preserve, protect, and defend our God given natural rights, as recognized in the US Constitution. City and local governments should only exercise the limited and enumerated powers granted by the US Constitution and the constitution of the state of Idaho to provide for the public good by doing for the people those necessary and proper things they cannot do for themselves, or do better by themselves. Every level of government in the US should be limited in its powers and duties by a written constitution or code of laws that enables the governors to govern but restrains them from exceeding those enumerated powers. The ultimate power should always reside in the people. As George Washington wrote, "The power under the Constitution will always be in the People. It is entrusted for certain defined purposes, and for a certain limited period, to representatives of their own chusing; and whenever it is executed contrary to their Interest, or not agreeable to their wishes, their Servants can, and undoubtedly will be, recalled." — letter to Bushrod Washington, 9 November 1787
